OBTAINING YOUR DRIVERS ELIGIBILITY CERITIFICATE

After receiving a driver education certificate from your behind the wheel instructor you must obtain a driver eligibility certificate from your high school.

 Please note, your school may require additional documentation to obtain a Driver Eligibility Certificate. This is a standardized form created by iDrive Hand over Hand Driving School, to guide students to the next step of obtaining a North Carolina permit.

After completing both classroom and behind the wheel, students must take their driver education certificate and previous semester's report card to Student Services to obtain an eligibility certificate. Student services will check the student grades before issuing the eligibility certificate. The driver eligibility certificate is valid for 30 days. Make sure you make your appointment with NCDMV before picking up your Drivers Eligibility Certificate. Appointments can only be made on-line due to the COVID 19 Pandemic.

North Carolina law reflects a coordinated statewide effort to motivate and encourage students to complete high school. The legislation requires that a student's driving permit or license be revoked if a student is unable to maintain adequate progress or drops out of school. Adequate progress is defined as passing 70% of all courses. If you do not meet this requirement, you will not be issued an eligibility certificate and/or your permit/license will be revoked by the NC DMV.

When you go to the NC DMV, you must have the following items:

- Driver Education Certificate
- Driver Eligibility Certificate
- Original Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Parent/Legal Guardian
- Proof of Residence (School Records, Savings account statements, etc.) Students name)
