

Driver Education Courses (Answers for Parents)

1. A grade of 70% is passing for the class; however, the DMV will require your teen to make and 80% in their permit test. If they score between 70 and 80 on their classroom final strongly encourage them to review resources found on the idrivehh.com website.
2. It will be approximately three (3) – six (6) weeks until the oldest student from this class is scheduled for BTW (Behind The Wheel). BTW instructors will have one (1) student in the car for training; therefore, your child is scheduled, please call and cancel if for some reason they can not make the scheduled lesson 24 hours in advance.
3. Your child will drive for a total of 6 hours.
4. When in behind the wheel lessons a dress code applies—no flip flops, please use closed in shoes.
5. When your child is 15 or older, they should take the completion certificate (received from the BTW Instructor) to student services to get the Education Eligibility Certificate. This certificate is only good for 30 days; therefore, they should get it on time to use it but not so early that it expires. We recommend you make your DMV appointment first. Please see attached the instructions for getting the Drivers Eligibility Certificate.

To Get A Permit

- Visit the DMV Website to get information regarding scheduling an appointment, the hours of operations and locations.
- Take with you, the certificate of completion that the student gets from the BTW instructor, the Education Certificate of Eligibility, original or certified birth certificate, social security card, and a licensed parent/guardian.
- Students may drive from 5 AM-9 PM only during the first 6 months of the learners permit Level I
- Any moving violations or seat belt infractions will extend the time they need to have their permit.
- After 12 months of permit driving with a supervising adult (over 21yr.) with 5 years driving experience) and logging 60 hours (10 of these at night), they can go to DMV and take the road test to obtain the level II Provisional License.
- At this time, parents will have to prove that they are added to their insurance policy (Prior to the Road Test)
- Your teen can then drive from 5 AM-9Pm without a supervising adult and have one unrelated minor passenger or as many siblings as they want.
- After 6 months of violation free driving, they have to go back to DMV and apply for the level three (3), after 9 pm license.
- Students are not allowed to be behind the wheel until they receive their learners permit; and student/parent getting caught will face Child Endangerment.
